1 Affordable Homes for the Next Generation



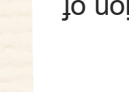

2 Keeping our Area Green & Clean

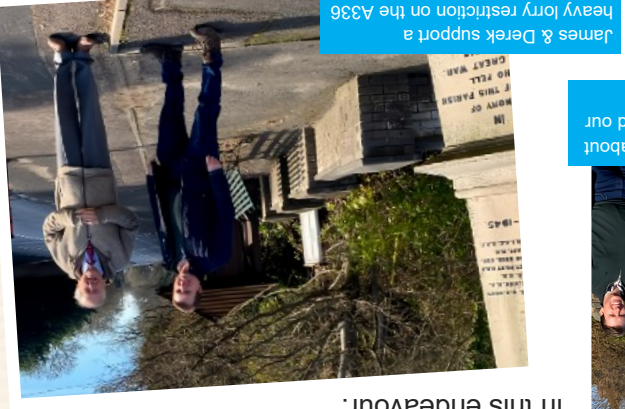
