Donna Jones was elected as Police and Crime Commissioner on 10 May 2021.

Donna has been a Magistrate in Hampshire for sixteen years. This has helped her develop a strong background in criminal justice. When she was appointed by the Lord Chancellor in October 2005, she was the youngest member of the judiciary in England and Wales.

Donna was elected to the Hilsea ward of Portsmouth City Council in 2008. From 2014-2018, Donna was the first woman to be elected the Leader of the Council, presiding over a £780 million budget, when the Conservatives took control, replacing Lib Dem Gerald Vernon-Jackson. She has a thorough understanding of managing public sector finances, of generating new income and removing wastage from outdated contracts ensuring our taxes are spent wisely.

In the 2019 General Election, Donna contested Portsmouth South, challenging incumbent MP, Labour's Stephen Morgan.
